

#### **COMMUNION IN THE PANDEMIC**

As you know, the pandemic has brought changes to the ways in which we can worship and experience our traditions. One change has been in the way we share communion. We had been concerned that communion would not be possible in the sanctuary throughout the duration of the pandemic.



But we may have found a solution! On October 4<sup>th</sup> we shared communion together as a church community both virtually for those joining via livestream and using the "Celebration Cups" in the sanctuary. Containing both prepackaged wafer and juice, the Celebration Cups provide a much safer way for us to partake of this important ritual in our worship. Many thanks to Bill and Katie Powell for discovering these cups and talking with other churches who have had success in using this method.

In consultation with the Reopening Committee is was decided to change the frequency of communion during this time as well. We celebrated communion on October 4 which was World Wide Communion. Assuming that we feel comfortable using this method we **will celebrate again on November 29** (Advent 1), and then the first Sunday in Lent, Easter, and Pentecost.
