Call to Worship and Prayer of Approach (based on Joel 2: 1-2, 12-17)

Come as people who are broken, who have made mistakes, who seek healing.

We hear the inner voice of God inviting us to return.

Come, listen to Christ's invitation to repent from brokenness.

We come to mark the beginning of the Lenten season, seeking the Spirit's guidance for our deepening and for our growing.

Come and commune with God as we pray:

An Offering of Tears

On the tear-shaped piece of paper, you are invited to write or draw something that represent your tears, your laments, or ways in which you separate yourself from God. Then on the reverse side, write down what you need from God or from others or what positive change you might make. Keep the tears for later in the service.

Prayer of Tears (based on Lamentations 2: -18-19).

Cry aloud to the Lord! Let tears stream down like a torrent.

We yearn to do away with our burdens of sin, our tears of injustice and of oppression.

Arise and cry out in the night! Pour out your heart like water in God's presence. We listen for God's grace-filled answer, praying for relief from inner wilderness. Here, accept our sorry and our repentance, O God.

Here, O Christ, accept our repentance as we offer our tears to you.

God Invites Us to Respond

Offering of our Tears You are invited to symbolically put your lament and tears in a bowl.

The Cross of our Repentance The Lord be with you. And also with you. Lift up your hearts. We lift them up to God. Give God your thanks and praise. It is right to give God our thanks and our praise. Let us pray together. You have created us out of the dust of the earth. Grant that these ashes may be to us a sign of our mortality and our penitence. May we remember that it is only in Christ we live. May this cross remind us of God's call to repentance. Amen.

(Anoint yourself or the person beside you, on the forehead or on the back of your hand).

You may say: "Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return".

Blessing:
