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#### MINISTER'S MESSAGE

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#### **UCW JAM SALE RETURNS!**



#### MESSAGE FROM THE CHURCH COUNCIL

Hopefully, many of you have now had your second Covid vaccine shot, and others of you have appointments booked. It has been very encouraging to see the rates of vaccination growing in Peel Region, and in Ontario as a whole. Please get your shot. It protects not only yourself, but your friends and family. This is how we will return to some degree of normalcy. Also remember that even after you receive your second dose, that it takes a couple weeks to fully develop protection against the virus.

It is also very encouraging to see case counts coming down significantly. The Delta variant is still of significant concern, and we are not out of the woods yet, but we are moving in the right direction. We are all looking forward to being able to worship again in person. We have decided that the Church will not be opening for in-person worship during the summer. July is too early to consider this, and Rev Jessica will be on vacation in August. Pulpit supply for August was arranged several months ago and was arranged for virtual services as the various speakers all live remotely.

If things continue to improve, we hope to be able to open the Church again in September – possibly the Sunday following Labour Day. The Re-opening Committee will meet again in August to relook at the protocols developed last summer, and to modify or update them. At this point we still do not know what restrictions will be in place, but we will continue to follow all Public Health Guidelines. Initially, we will still not be able to have the choir, but we will endeavour to include music wherever we can. Keep well and stay safe!

The election of Commissioners to GC 44 occurred at the May meeting Horseshoe Falls which included the election of Rev Jessica McCrae! We look forward to supporting Rev Jessica in her role as a Commissioner which will include electing a new Moderator and the General Council Executive, setting policies and dealing with proposals from Regional Councils, setting the budget framework for the next 3 years and approving the assessment formula, and oversight of denominational level ministry and mission. It is an opportunity for Rev Jessica to have a direct impact on the future of the United Church of Canada.

# PATHWAY COMMUNITY PROGRAMS JOB POSITION

Pathway Community Programs and the Audrey Pritchard Breakfast Club are programs which SUC has been instrumental in organizing and supporting since the inception over 20 years ago. Four of our members presently sit on the board along with representatives from Solel and Unitarian congregations. They will be hiring a new coordinator for the breakfast program to begin in Sept. at the Forest Ridge location (Ridgeway and Collegeway). **Please share the information below with anyone who you think might be interested in applying to this position.** 



### BREAKFAST CLUB COORDINATOR JOB DESCRIPTION

The coordinator of this program will be responsible for supervising the Breakfast Club.

#### The duties include:

- preparing the food each school day morning the program runs September to June, school days only
- managing the volunteers who will assist in preparation and serving, and tracking volunteer hours
- purchasing food and supplies
- ensuring a clean, safe and healthy environment
- maintaining and submitting records including children's registration, meals served, food expenditures, food donated
- encouraging a positive attitude towards children, volunteers and parents

#### Remuneration:

- -\$18 per hour based on
  - 2.5 hours per school day for Breakfast Club
  - 2 hours per week for grocery shopping
  - 2 hours per month for financial reporting
  - compensation for mileage at \$0.55 per km for food bank and grocery pickup
  - any special activities or events confirmed in advance
