Sunday School

This Week's Sunday School Activities - Last Sunday's scripture reading in the service was Mark 9: 38-50. I encourage you to read this scripture passage again, especially in light of The National Day for Truth and Reconciliation this past Thursday. I also encourage you to take time to reflect on how you felt after experiencing the day.

1) As mentioned above, the focus Bible Reading this week is Mark 9: 38-50. The season after Pentecost is also known as Ordinary Time. The scripture for this week however is not at all about being ordinary. It is about being different and being clear about following God's ways. This week's reading invites us all to explore what it means to be faithful and to consider ways that we create barriers or tend toward attitudes of exclusion and how we can create better communities of belonging for all peoples.

Issues of boundaries and acceptance are some of the questions that the first disciples and first readers raised in the gospel of Mark. In a cultural context where who was "in", who was "out" and who was "right" were important concerns. The first disciples find themselves preoccupied with another person who is not part of their little group. In this story, Jesus moves the disciples away from thinking about who belongs and who doesn't. Instead, Jesus challenges them to a broader understanding of community and to overcome their own challenges and limitations rather than someone else's. Jesus draws the disciples away from their own exclusionary attitudes and to see the way God is at work in the community.

Questions to consider after reading this Bible passage

a) What happens to you when you help someone else who may think or act differently from you? b) How do you feel when you include these people in your group?

One of the marks of Christian discipleship is a willingness to be different. This is not always easy. However, being different can result in healing, life and a better place of belonging for others in the community. Are there ways that you can be different to more faithfully follow Jesus?

2) Prayer: God of love, sometimes we are too confident that our ways are the only ways and we become too comfortable in our exclusive

communities. Grant us grace, humility and wisdom to expand our ways of thinking so we might honour your God-given differences in the people around us and better accept your way of guidance for us all. Amen

- Are you awaiting test results for COVID-19?
- Have you travelled outside of Canada in the past 14 days or been in contact with someone who is sick and who has travelled outside of Canada in the past 14 days?
