

# **Sunday School**

#### This Week's Sunday School Activities – The Power of Listening

Lydia is a listener who welcomes the gospel's message and the transforming power of the Spirit, which brings Paul to her. Lydia's baptism is important to many. Waters of life wash through all the readings today inviting love, making persons whole and imparting holy presence and peace.

1) The Scripture Reading during the Service is Psalm 67. The call to praise in this Psalm makes clear the universality of God's graciousness, extending far beyond Israel and summoning all nations and people of the world. Creation itself is both a part of God's blessings and also joins in the song of praise to the ends of the earth. Singing God's praise is born out of experiencing the saving power found in God's way of justice and compassion.

The Sermon is based on Acts 16:9-15. This passage reminds us that the Spirit of God is never limited by traditional sources of power in order to bring about change and transformation. Prior to his conversion, Paul often used violence which he deemed necessary to maintain control and focus on the authority of political and religious leaders. Rather than change through coercion, the power made evident through the Spirit of God brought change through the simple act of listening. Listening to the Spirit, Paul lets go of these original plans. He arrives in Philippi and sees a number of women and listens intently to them. Lydia is among them, an independent woman who is the head of her household. While spending time with Paul, she opens her heart to what he says and they support each other in their ministries.

Additional Scripture Readings: John 14:23-29, and Revelation 21: 10, 22-22:5

Reflections on the readings from this Sunday.

a) What questions do you have about the Acts 16 reading? b) What happens in this story that suggests that Paul and Lydia minister to one another? c) What images of hospitality do you find in these passages? d) Where have you seen welcome and hospitality offered in your church community? e) What can help us to be more hospitable and welcoming to others at school and in the community?

To listen eagerly is a true skill. It helps people welcome fresh possibilities, new directions and unexpected ones. Paul follows the lead of a vision. Lydia opens her heart and then her home. This week's reading from the book of Acts invites us to reflect on our own experiences of hearing and responding to the good news of this season.

2) Gracious God, welcoming Christ, empowering Spirit: stir the waters by which we gather. In the ways you receive us, teach us how to receive others. In the grace with which you create a home for us, may we be bold to practise hospitality. Amen
