History of United Church Women

The UCW officially came into being on January 1, 1962. Its purpose was to unite women of the congregation for the total mission of the church and to provide a medium through which we may express our loyalty and devotion to Jesus Christ in Christian witness, study, fellowship and service. (ROP 1960, p.304)

Women integrated into their national-level work into the boards of the United Church, and blended their two organizations, the Women Missionary Society and the Women's Association, into one: the United Church Women. The Women's Federation also joined the UCW at this time. Across the country, 300,000 women joined as charter members. The structure of the new organization was the same as that of the national church: Conference, Presbyterial and local units, with UCW representatives participating at all levels of United Church structure.

Since the inauguration of the UCW, many projects have been initiated and completed, from worship and Bible study, to sending barrels of clothing overseas, to supporting the Mission & Service of the United Church of Canada with over \$129 million in contributions.

Sunday School

This Week's Sunday School Activities – Stand Firm in Your Identity

Scripture links our identity to the identity of God. If we are made in the image and likeness of God, as Genesis tells us, then the image we have of God matters a great deal. If we perceive God as controlling, this shapes our identity.

If however, our image of God is of one who is caring about people, their language and place within the community, then we are more likely to develop an identity that does not oppress others. The resurrection of Christ is God's response to the domination of Rome and therefore shapes the character of all who live as faithful disciples to Christ.

1) The Scripture Reading during the Service is Acts 9:-36-43. This reading focuses on a disciple in Joppa whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was always doing good and helping the poor and was a beautiful seamstress. What is your identity? How shall you be known? These are the questions with which Tabitha lived. They are also questions for the early church to whom Acts is written as well as questions for us today. Tabitha's name links her to her ancestors Abraham and Sarah, who trusted God would lead them to new life; Moses and Miriam, who led people out of slavery; the prophets who proclaimed the justice and compassion of God. Tabitha was a follower of Jesus the Christ, who was from the same lineage. Dorcas is her Greek name, the official language of the Roman Empire. After Tabitha/Dorcas dies, Peter comes to Joppa to see her for himself. Alone in the upper room he says "Tabitha, get up". She opens her eyes and gets up. She was then presented to the believers and widows and from then on she continued to give witness to resurrection compassion and resistance.

Additional Scripture Readings: Psalm 23, John 10: 22-30 and Revelation 7: 9-17

Reflections on the readings from this Sunday.

a) What kind of relationship do you think Tabitha had with the widows in Joppa? b) What do you think Tabitha is honoured by the writer in Acts with the designation as a "disciple"? c) What can we learn from these readings about love and service that is life-giving? d) Who are good role models in the world today of this kind of leadership? e) What are some ways that we can show God's love in our everyday lives?

Some traditions observe this Sunday as Good Shepherd Sunday and Psalm 23 has direct thematic connections with that observance. John 10:22-30 is set in an entire chapter that explores Jesus as the Good Shepherd. Consider Tabitha's story. In what ways might her ministry provide another perspective into this observance and our own identity as those who "shepherd" the way of Christ?

2) To what should we devote ourselves, O God? Turn us toward those who show us how to serve as neighbours through life-giving words and deeds. May we be bold in following their example, as we grow as disciples of the Christ. Amen
