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MINISTER'S MESSAGE

As we enter the season of autumn, I am reflecting on the story of Ezra and Nehemiah. Two books of the Hebrew Bible (also known as the Old Testament) are named after them. They recount the return of the people of Israel to the Holy Land after decades of exile to rebuild the city of Jerusalem and the Temple. Under the leadership of the scribe Ezra and later the governor Nehemiah, with the support of the emperor of Persia, and, most importantly, with the blessing of God, the people of Israel overcame great obstacles and re-established Jewish life in the land.

To a much lesser degree folks return to church each autumn. Our property isn't in ruins like 6th century BCE Jerusalem, but we do have a fairly major property restoration project ahead of us. Simultaneously, we are kicking off a congregation-wide project to renew our church community vision and values. Of course, we will also hold our regular congregational events like the Harvest of Crafts sale. All that before Advent and Christmas come!

If this seems like a lot, well, it is. Yet I feel a rush of energy in our people, too! I believe that we have the right people in the right roles for such a time as this. And not everyone has to do everything. Actually, no one should do everything. In the books of Ezra and Nehemiah, different folks did different tasks. Masons and carpenters did the renovation project; priests and Levites restored worship; other stood guard against bandits and hostile neighbours. So you should decide to do one or a couple things well and then rejoice at the work of others. To quote a much more contemporary source (okay...it's High School Musical), "We're ALL in THIS to-geth-er!"

I pray this autumn is a time for you to restore your church routines and maybe try something (one thing) new. The Spirit is guiding and equipping us.




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Streetsville United at the Blue Jays game!

FINANCE UPDATE

We are now 8 months completed into this year. The results are favourable as we compare the projected deficit to our actual deficit. The income receipts are higher than anticipated due to increased rentals (\$13,888 better than budget) which offsets the reduced



income from givings (\$6,135 lower than budget YTD). Total receipts are \$10,149 better than YTD linear budget. Expenses are well controlled at \$9,216 less than YTD linear budget. The net **deficit** is \$3,949 compared to the projected deficit of \$23,313 which is encouraging. However, the large summer rental income for the year has been paid and so the deficit for the months ahead is expected to increase significantly.

We are fortunate to now have the personnel to increase our congregation and have people return to SUC – a full time minister and a part-time music director. We are blessed to have great ministry incorporating fresh ideas and wonderful music from both our choir and Boomer band. Now it's time to fill the pews and bring our envelope offerings back to pre-pandemic levels. While expected, we do have a long way to go to be at breakeven!

Masonry Repair Campaign

The Finance Committee has developed a plan to cover the costs of this repair, but we need your help to protect our Heritage building!

We are most fortunate to have a Bequest Fund which can be used to cover 75% of the repair bill, approximately \$30,000. The remaining 25% must be covered by the congregation, about \$10,000.



Our plan has 4 ways you may support this project:

- Income from this fall's Macgregor Meat fundraiser will go to fund the repair. The information sheets will be available in October with delivery scheduled for Thursday November 9. It is important to share the information with your family, friends and neighbours – once they try the products, they love them and become repeat customers. Also share cases with others – most products are individually vacuum packed and so a case is easily divided.
- 2. SUC will be hosting a Coffee House on Saturday November 18. Save the Date and bring along friends and neighbours for a fun evening of music and refreshments. Tickets will be available for \$15 each and will include coffee and dessert. All proceeds from this event will support the Masonry campaign.
- Donations may be made directly to SUC either by cash, cheque, or e-transfer. Be sure to indicate that the donation is for the <u>MASONRY REPAIR</u>.
- 4. The UCW will match all congregational donations (#3 above) to a maximum of \$5000. Donors who contribute by Nov 30 will have their names entered into a draw for a \$100 gift card for a Streetsville restaurant. The draw will take place at Coffee Hour on Dec 3. Many thanks to the UCW for providing these incentives!

We need and encourage you to participate in all parts of this campaign. Should the total of all 4 aspects of the plan exceed the cost of the repair bill, the excess funds will go back into the General account and help reduce the budget deficit for this year.

We appreciate your continued support of Streetsville United Church and especially this important campaign!
